SPEAKER BIOS:

Doug Hatler (Enviance Inc.) - Doug is responsible for creating and managing value-added partnerships with the world's largest environmental consulting and engineering firms, who are using Enviance as a technology platform to deliver EH&S compliance and management services to their clients as well as to manage their own internal compliance activities.

Mr. Hatler has been a professional in the environmental and information technology industry for 20 years. He started his career in site assessment and remediation with environmental consulting firms. In 1992, he joined Roche Pharmaceuticals, a multinational pharmaceutical and medical diagnostics company, as a corporate environmental regulatory specialist. In 1994, he changed assignments at Roche and joined a global team to design, construct, and start-up a \$700 Million pharmaceutical R&D and launch facility in Florence, South Carolina. While there, Mr. Hatler implemented software systems to enable the environmental staff to be more productive and efficient. In 1998, his experience with software systems at Roche led him to a full-time career in the information technology industry including 3.5 years with Intel Corporation, who sponsored Mr. Hatler's Executive MBA. Mr. Hatler received a Bachelors Degree in Environmental Science from Cook College, a Master of Science in Environmental Engineering from the New Jersey Institute of Technology, and an

Executive Master of Business Administration degree from the Rutgers Business School.

Edward Keith Jr. (NRG North America) – Mr. Keith is responsible for managing the environmental water and waste programs for NRG's portfolio of assets in New England. Mr. Keith has been a professional in the electric industry for 35 years. He has worked for both major utilities in Connecticut in varied positions including customer service, transmission and distribution engineering, and generating station engineering and operations. Prior to joining NRG in 1999, he served ten years as an environmental professional for Northeast Utilities where he was responsible for their electric stations' water and waste programs. Mr. Keith is an active member of the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection Water Bureau Advisory Committee, The Connecticut DPUC Water Advisory Committee, the Environmental Policies Council of the Connecticut Business and Industry Association, the Associated Industries of Massachusetts. Mr. Keith received a Bachelors Degree in Mechanical Engineering from Norwich University and a Masters of Business Administration degree from the University of New Haven.

Phil Hillman (Polaroid) - Mr. Hillman joined Polaroid in 1978 as a Technical Supervisor making positive receiving sheet for instant film systems. Prior to Polaroid, Phil worked for W.R. Grace Corporation in Cambridge as a Senior Chemist and Group Leader. Over the next 12 years, he held various assignments within manufacturing. In 1990, Phil was appointed General Manager of Inner City, a subsidiary of Polaroid. He held this position until 1992 when he was promoted to Plant Manager Industrial Coatings Division. In 1994 he was selected as Senior Manager, Environmental Programs for Manufacturing and then in 1997 was promoted to the position of Corporate Director, Health, Safety and Environment. His outside affiliations include President of the Dorchester Bay Economic Development Corporation, board member of the Charles River Watershed Association, Board member of the Children Services of Roxbury and President of the Boston Urban Youth Foundation. Phil was awarded a Bachelor of Science Degree from Roosevelt University in Chemistry and a MBA from Boston University.

James C. Harrison (Polaroid) - Jim is the Site EHS Manager for Polaroid's Waltham manufacturing facilities. He manages compliance with all applicable Federal, State, and local regulations. The most prevalent ones are Title V Operating permit, MWRA Sewer Discharge regulations, RCRA Hazardous Waste, NPDES Permit, AST/UST's, MCP Soil & Groundwater Contamination, OSHA Safety and Health. Jim is currently building an EMS with elements similar to ISO 14001.

Jim has a B.S. in Chemical Engineering and a M.S. in Engineering Management both from Northeastern University and is a Certified Hazardous Materials Manager. Jim's initial career experience (15 yrs.) was as a project engineer at Polaroid's Chemical Operations Division. This involved designing and installing, UST's, Hazardous Waste Storage Tanks, Reactor & Filtration systems, Wastewater Treatment Equipment, Air Abatement Devices, and Groundwater Remediation Systems. Jim has been working actively in the EHS business for the last 13 years.

At the end of the off-ramp, turn right onto Trapelo Road

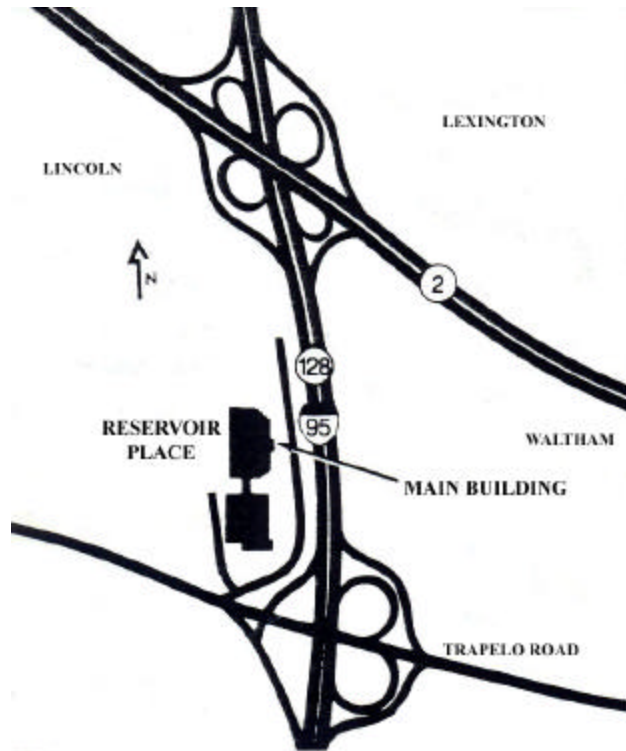
Take the first right into **Reservoir Place** (the big silver building)
